What Am I Inviting People To?

You are inviting your friends to your place to hang out, watch a movie with you and then to come back and go to church with you. However, instead of meeting in a crowded church lobby (or a Loading Dock if you have been to New Life-Chantilly!), you are in the comfort of your own home, where you can talk about what is being said as it happens without anyone looking at you funny!

What Do I Need?

Something to watch a movie and the service on. You can use an Apple TV, Fire TV, Roku or DVD player to watch the movie and then you can use a computer, tablet or phone to view the service. If you have the capability, it would be cool to play it on a central TV from one of the devices. This can be done through a cable from the device to the TV, or a streaming solution like a Roku or Google Chromecast.

Should I Offer Some Refreshments/Snacks? I Mean, People Are Coming to MY House.

What a great idea! Coffee, tea, soda, snacks – you know your friends better than we do. Just make them feel comfortable and at home: think of it like you are hosting a party. So if you want to have some refreshments and a few finger food items that would be great, but not necessary.

Can Children Come to This Too?

Yes! They can either watch along with the whole group OR you have a babysitter watch the children in another room so the adults can participate without distraction.
